## From Rev. Dr. Jeff McDonald on COVID Protocols

With the recent news of a sharp rise in COVID cases among the unvaccinated population due to the Delta variant, I want to reiterate the safety protocols in place at St. Paul'. During worship and on campus at St. Paul's UMC, people who are fully vaccinated will have the option of either wearing or not wearing a mask. All unvaccinated individuals should wear a mask and practice physical distancing. Not all people have had the opportunity for a vaccination, especially children under 12. For this reason, if you are more comfortable wearing a mask, we encourage you to do so. For children's ministry, masks are optional outside. Indoors, children over the age of 3, as well as youth and adults, will continue to wear a mask for children's ministry activities. We will continue to monitor worship numbers and COVID data. We will continue to sign up for worship on Sunday mornings and to fill out the health screening questionnaire. For those unable to attend in-person worship, we will continue to offer online services and options for meetings and studies. Our staff is thankful for your continued commitment to John Wesley's principle of do no harm.



## Other Healing Circles Ongoing, Expanding


Helen Spaw conducts Healing Circles and Healing Art Circles on a variety of topics, some ongoing with entry at any time, some short-term with a self-contained group.

## Mere Christianity



## Cornerstone Society Votes to Award Grants to JFON and FAM

In its first grant-funding vote, the Cornerstone Society has selected Justice for All Immigrants (formerly JFON Houston) and FAM Houston (www.famhoustontx.org) to receive its 2021 awards.

These ministries were chosen from among five candidates, the others being Bo's Place, the Creative Life Foundation, and Loving Houston.

Cornerstone members also voted to split the grant funding of \$7625 on a 2:1 basis, keeping the awards aligned with the customary St. Paul's Methodist Foundation funding.

Justice for All Immigrants will receive \$5000 to help support their general operations, a need that has been magnified as they have expanded their services to regions in Texas outside of Houston.

FAM has been granted \$2500 for their Farm of Peace initiative, a community of Congolese refugee women building a community farm in West Houston on land owned by the Alief Independent School District.

The grants will be awarded at the Cornerstone Society Celebration on September 11, 2021. Members are urged to mark their calendars for this breakfast celebration of the good work of the Cornerstone Society in its inaugural year and look for an invitation in their email inbox in mid-August.

Sixty-six members of the Cornerstone Society participated in on-line voting conducted from June 23, 2021 through July 6, 2021.

## Familiar Faces in New Roles at St. Paul's

Both have been St. Paul's members for the bulk of their adult lives, spending much of that time in a variety of volunteer roles here. Both have academic backgrounds in science. Both have three children. And both are beginning new roles on St. Paul's staff.

Susie Vanlandingham is the new Director of Children's Music, and Anna Anderson is the new Director of the Rutabaga After-School Program.

Susie has been singing in church choirs since she was three years old, the same age that St. Paul's children begin singing in Joyful Noise, the music assembly for children up to the first grade.

Previously assisting Anna Teagarden with these choirs and more recently interim director, Susie now will be directing the Wesley Singers (1st and 2nd grades) and the Choristers (3rd through 8th grades). She also will collaborate with Joel Trekell, Assistant Music Director and Organist, who will direct the Treble Choir and develop

music opportunities for young men and youth in our congregation. Through the Voice for Life curriculum of the Royal Schol of Church Music (RSCM), these young vocalists learn about liturgy, music theory, sacred repertoire, and what it means to be a part of a choir. Susie recently completed a Master's in Sacred Music at the University of St. Thomas, and she holds a master's from Rice University in environmental science and engineering.

Anna holds a degree in biomedical science from Texas A&M University and has been teaching for the past several years at St. Paul's School, first as a classroom teacher and in recent years as the head of the school's music enrichment program where the children are introduced to rhythm, melody, pitch and other components of music. She also has worked with St. Paul's Youth for many years, primarily coordinating meals for Sunday nights and mission projects.



For almost 30 years, the Rutabaga After-School Program has been a mentoring and enrichment program for at-risk children who attend nearby elementary schools. After a hiatus due to COVID, the program will resume on August 30 from 3 to 5 pm in Abraham Station. We will need volunteers in a variety of ways and timeframes. 
